

Pursuant to SC Code 23-20-40(B), Council must approve any and all Mutual Aid Agreements with other law enforcement authorities entered into by the Columbia Police Department. As you all are aware, on January 18th, 2022, Resolution No.: R-2022-005 was brought before you all to approve and ratify the Mutual Aid Agreements between the City of Columbia and the City of Columbia Police Department. Attached to that Resolution was "Exhibit A," which consisted of a list of various law enforcement agencies that CPD had prior agreements with. Since that time, the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs Columbia Healthcare System has reached out to us asking that we enter into a Mutual Aid Agreement with them. As this was not an entity previously listed in Exhibit A of Resolution No.: R-2022-005, we are seeking to have Council authorize the City Manager and Chief Holbrook to execute this agreement.
