Approving the Honorary Naming of the intersection of Blanding Street and Assembly Street "Judge L. Casey Manning Court"

WHEREAS, the Honorable L. Casey Manning was born in the City of Dillon to Paul Manning, Sr. and Harnethea Bethea Manning. He attended the public schools in Dillon and received a basketball scholarship from the University of South Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable L. Casey Manning was the first African-American basketball player at the University of South Carolina and was inducted into the South Carolina Athletic Hall of Fame as a member of the class of 2018. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and history from the University of South Carolina in 1973. He was a scholar athlete throughout his four-year tenure, receiving the Freshman Academic Award, the Outstanding Senior Award and being named in Who's Who Among Colleges and Universities. He received his Juris Doctor degree from the University of South Carolina School of Law in 1977. He has been the radio color analyst for the Gamecock's men's basketball team for over twenty-five years; and

WHEREAS, at the time of his retirement, the Honorable L. Casey Manning will have been the longest serving resident Circuit Court Judge in the Richland County Judicial Center's current location at 1701 Main Street; and

WHEREAS, the Honorable L. Casey Manning has served with distinction on the bench for twenty-eight years to include the Circuit Court Judges' Advisory Committee, S.C. Commission on Judicial Conduct, S.C. Sentencing Guidelines Commission, Hearing Masters, Rules on Judicial Discipline and Standards and the Criminal Docketing Committee; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED this 6th day of December, 2022, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbia hereby approve the honorary naming of the intersection of Blanding Street and Assembly Street "Judge L. Casey Manning Court". The design and color of the honorary signs shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Public Works.

Casey Manning, at the time of his retirement, will have been the longest-serving resident circuit court judge in the Richland County Judicial Center's current location at 1701 Main Street. He has served with distinction on the bench across 28 years, including on the Circuit Court Judges' Advisory Committee; S.C. Commission on Judicial Conduct; S.C. Sentencing Guidelines Commission; Hearing Masters, Rules on Judicial Discipline & Standards; and the Criminal Docketing Committee. Amongst the honors he has received are: Richland County Bar Association Matthew J. Perry Civility Award, South Carolina Association of Justice The Outstanding Contribution to Justice Award (Portrait Fund Honoree), American Board of Trial Advocates Award, University of South Carolina Richard T. Greener Excellence in Athletics Award, and the South Carolina Supreme Court G. Dewey Oxner, Jr. Lawyer Mentoring Award.
