

#### **RESOLUTION NO.: R-2021-053**

Approving the honorary naming of the 1900 and 2000 blocks of Cushman Drive "Bishop C.L. Lorick, Sr. Drive"

WHEREAS, Bishop Colie L. Lorick, Jr. was born in Lexington County, attended Orangeburg County public schools and graduated from North Industrial Institute and served briefly in the United States Army; and,

WHEREAS, Bishop Lorick and his wife, the former Elease Porterfield, moved to Columbia in 1950 and in 1951 at the age of 23 he was baptized and began his service to the church first in the positions of Deacon, Sunday School Teacher, Superintendent and Youth President at Holy Ghost Station and Mount Sinai. He began his ministry in 1962 serving as an Associate Minister at Mount Sinai Holiness Church and was instrumental in the creation of the Youth Progress for Christ organization which was designed to enhance wholesome activities and fellowship among Apostolic youth. The mission he started on Bluff Road in 1964 quickly grew and was relocated to 1912 Cushman Drive where a military barrack from Fort Jackson served as its temporary structure until a permanent sanctuary was built; and,

WHEREAS, under the affiliation of the United Church of Jesus Christ (Apostolic) Bishop Lorick served as the National Youth Overseer for many years, was consecrated a Bishop in 1979, served as Diocesan of the Northern Diocese and state of Florida, was the assistant to the Presiding Bishop to the Islands of Nevis and St. Kitts. He was appointed to the South Carolina in 1980 and Vice-Presiding Bishop of the United Church in 1992 and to International Director of Auxiliary and Committee Personnel in 2000; and,

WHEREAS, Bishop Lorick had many firsts in his life setting the way for future leaders – he was the first black to integrate radio station WQXL; launched the first call-in religious radio broadcast "The Rehoboth Hour of Concern"; launched WTGH AM 620 "The Gospel Highway" Columbia's first black-owned full-time gospel radio station with a group formed by ministers, businessmen and his oldest son Bishop Colie Lorick, Jr. who formed Midlands Communication Co., Inc. where he served as the Vice-President, Assistant Station Manager and General Manager; and,

WHEREAS, Bishop Lorick made a positive impact on many lives not only in the community but throughout the state in his service on the Richland County Black Adoption Committee, Greenview Community Civic Club, Billy Graham Crusade Committee, Columbia Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance and One Church One Child. His legacy lives on in the church and community through those he guided as a father figure and mentor, were recipients of his compassion, spiritual and financial support; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED this 4th day of May, 2021, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbia hereby approve the honorary naming of the 1900 and 2000 blocks of Cushman Drive "Bishop C.L. Lorick, Sr. Drive". The design and color of the honorary toppers shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Public Works.

It is our honor and privilege to submit to you letters and supporting documents requesting The renaming of Cushman Drive to the BISHOP C. L. LORICK, SR. DRIVE.

Bishop C. L. Lorick, Sr. was our pastor for 37 years of the Rehoboth United Church, 1912 Cushman Drive, Columbia, SC 29204 where he grew the ministry from only two members to 400 members. He was a citizen who was actively concerned and involved in our community for the wellbeing of its residents.



# Bishop Colie L. Lorick, Sr.

was born May 5, 1928 in Lexington County, South Carolina and attended the Orangeburg County Public Schools where he graduated from North Industrial Institute. After graduation he had a short tour of duty with the U. S. Army. He united in marriage in 1946 to the former Elease Porterfield. They moved to Columbia in 1950.

#### In His Service

Bishop Lorick received the baptism of the Holy Spirit in 1951 at the age of 23. He served in his churches, Holy Ghost Station (Mother M. J. Fields) and Mount Sinai (Elder Tommy Anderson), in the positions of Deacon, Sunday School teacher, Superintendent, and Youth President. After very faithful service in these roles, he answered the call to the preaching ministry in September, 1962. He served for two years as an Associate Minister at Mount Sinai Holiness Church under Bishop Tommy Anderson. Minister Lorick, the late Bishop A.C. Jackson, and the late Bishop Willie Spann were instrumental in the implementation

of an organization called "Youth Progress for Christ," which was designed to enhance wholesome activities and fellowship among Apostolic young people.

In 1964, Minister Lorick was asked to conduct the opening service of a small mission located at 1822 Bluff Road. This mission had two faithful members; Mother Maimie Bell and Sister Florence Goodwin. A few others attended services occasionally. The pastor, Elder Joseph Anderson was in his 90's, declining in health, and unable to continue with his duties. The District Overseer, Bishop Frank B. Saunders, of Florence, South Carolina assigned Minister Lorick to assist him with the work of the mission. He served faithfully as assistant to Bishop Saunders for one year, and in May 1965, he was ordained by Bishop Randolph A. Carr, Presiding Bishop of the Church of God In Christ Jesus (Apostolic). He was installed as pastor of the mission which was named Rehoboth. The mission quickly grew to about thirty members it became apparent that the Bluff Road site was too small. Elder Lorick negotiated the first significant business transaction for the young church in purchasing property at 1912 Cushman Drive and a military barrack from Fort Jackson, which served as a temporary sanctuary. The congregation later constructed a permanent Rehoboth sanctuary and fellowship hall. Bishop Lorick also initiated plans for relocation to 3420 N. Beltline Boulevard.

#### **National Activities**

Elder Lorick and the church became an affiliate of the United Church of Jesus Christ (Apostolic) at the organization's first convocation in the summer of 1966 under Presiding Bishop, Dr. Monroe R. Saunders, Sr. He served for many years in the capacity of National Youth Overseer. In 1979, he was consecrated to the office of Bishop. He was assigned Diocesan of the Northern Diocese and state of Florida for one year each. He also served as assistant to the Presiding Bishop in the Islands of Nevis and St. Kitts. He was appointed to the South Carolina Diocese in 1980 upon the resignation of Bishop Frank B. Saunders. In 1992, he was appointed to the position of Vice-Presiding Bishop of the United Church. After serving in this capacity for six years, he was appointed to the position of international Director of Auxiliary and Committee Personnel for the United Church of Jesus Christ, Apostolic.

#### Radio Ministry

In 1972, Bishop Lorick launched South Carolina's first call-in religious radio broadcast, called "The Rehoboth Hour of Concern," over radio station WQXL, which was Columbia's first full-time Christian station. He was the first black to integrate this station, and had to overcome serious racial adversity in order to carry out his radio ministry. In 1981, he and his oldest son, Colie Jr. were part of a group of eight ministers and businessmen who formed Midland Communication Co., Inc. In 1984, this company launched Columbia's first black-owned full-time gospel radio station: WTGH AM 620, "The Gospel Highway." This station quickly became a favorite throughout South Carolina, and the popularity of gospel music increased rapidly. With Midlands Communication, he served in the capacities of Vice-President, Assistant Station Manager and General Manager.

#### **Community Involvement**

Bishop Lorick resigned from civil service employment in 1978 to assume the position of full time pastor. He became very active in community and civic affairs, serving on several boards and working with organizations such as The Black Adoption Agency, The Columbia Ministerial Alliance, One Church-One Child, Billy Graham Crusade Committee, North Columbia Civic Club, and Greenview Community Civic Club. Significant church sponsored outreach programs under his pastorate include the Youth Intervention Program and Prison Ministry.

### Post Retirement

On April 2, 2001 Bishop Lorick retired as pastor of Rehoboth after serving for thirty-seven years. With the ministry very near and dear to his heart, he continued to serve in an advisory role as Pastor Emeritus of the congregation. Bishop Lorick passed his vision for a new sanctuary on property owned by church at 3420 North Beltline to his son, Bishop C. L. Lorick, Jr. During his retirement, he resumed responsibility for the small church he started many years previously in Willingston, SC. He continued to pour endless hours and travel many miles for as long as his health allowed to ensure that the congregation in Willingston and the Fifth Episcopal Diocese continued to thrive.

## The Rehoboth Journey......



Rehoboth United Church had its beginning in 1964 in a storefront building located at 1822 Bluff Road. The name at the time was the Church of God in Christ Jesus (reflecting the name of the affiliate organization) and was under the leadership of Elder Joseph H. Anderson of Florence, SC. The congregation was comprised of two members: Mother Mamie Woods Bell and Mother Florence Goodwin. Because of Elder Anderson's age (90) and related health issues, the responsibility of officially opening the church at the Bluff Road location was given to young Minister C.L. Lorick, Sr.

Elder C. L. Lorick, Sr. was officially installed as pastor of the small congregation June 27, 1965. The name was changed to Rehoboth Mission – an affiliate of the Rehoboth Church of God in Christ Jesus. In 1966 the church affiliation changed to the newly organized United Church of Jesus Christ, Apostolic. Bishop Monroe R. Saunders was the founder and Presiding Bishop.





In October of 1967 the congregation purchased property at 1912 Cushman Drive. An army barrack was purchased

from Fort Jackson and renovated to become a worship facility. An open air service was held on the grounds on November 11, 1967 with the official opening and dedication on October 27, 1968. With the completion of the renovation project and a growing congregation, the full name became Rehoboth United Church of

Jesus Christ, Apostolic. In May 1969, construction plans began for the sanctuary that would be the final phase of the building. The new sanctuary was dedicated in January, 1975. The Rehoboth church family worshipped at the Cushman Drive location for forty-one years.



The need to expand ministries and the limited parking at Cushman Drive created an interest in relocating. A 6.5 acre tract of land located on Beltline Blvd. was purchased in January of 1996. Plans began to materialize for construction and relocation. On April 27, 2001 Bishop C. L. Lorick, Sr. retired as the active pastor of Rehoboth. Bishop C. L. Lorick, Jr. was installed as the new pastor on April 28, 2001.

The worship facility located at 3420 N. Beltline Boulevard was completed and dedicated on August 29, 2009.

The founding pastor, Bishop C. L. Lorick, Sr. was called to eternal rest on March 24, 2017. His service to Rehoboth as pastor and pastor emeritus spanned forty-four years. Twelve days later, on April 5, 2017 his son, Bishop C. L. Lorick, Jr. also departed this life. The congregation was stunned and devastated by the sudden loss of leadership. The staff of elders and executive board continued the ministry in the interim. The congregation elected Elder David A. Lorick, Sr. as the next pastor and officially installed him on November 11, 2017.
