

RESOLUTION NO.: R-2004-011

Authorizing 3 Rivers Music Festival 2004

WHEREAS, the 3 Rivers Music Festival ("Festival") is sponsoring a three-day music festival in the downtown Columbia area for Friday, April 16, 2004 through Sunday, April 18, 2004; and,

WHEREAS, the Festival has requested permission for merchants to operate sale booths as part of the celebration; and,

WHEREAS, it has been determined that such an event would be in the public interest; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council this 18th day of February, 2004, that between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m. on Friday, April 16, 2004; 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 17, 2004; and 2:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 18, 2004, merchants are authorized to operate sale booths for items normally sold in their course of business, except alcoholic beverages, beer and wine, within the closed off portions of Taylor Street between Assembly Street and Wayne Street; Lincoln Street between Hampton Street and Taylor Street; Gadsden Street between Hampton Street and Blanding Street; Hampton Street between Gadsden Street and Assembly Street; Park Street between Gervais Street and Taylor Street; Lady Street between Assembly Street and Lincoln Street; Washington Street between Lincoln Street and Assembly Street.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that sales of arts and crafts items and food and beverage items and game booths be permitted and that the Festival be authorized to determine and allocate available space to vendors and to charge reasonable fees to recover its costs in promoting and operating the festival. The Festival may limit the number of vendors based on

space available. Beer sales are authorized between 6:00 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. on Friday, April 16, 2004; 11:00 a.m. and 11:30 p.m. on Saturday, April 17, 2004; and 2:00 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. on Sunday, April 18, 2004. Food sales will stop at 12:00 a.m. on Friday, April 16, 2004 and Saturday, April 17, 2004; and at 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 18, 2004. The Festival shall prescribe the required application form and appropriate deadline for receiving applications; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all vendors be restricted to stationary location and the Festival shall approve or disapprove all amplified entertainment activities; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that only pedestrian traffic will be allowed within the area. All other traffic, including, but not limited to, automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles, skate boards, and horses, except police horses, is prohibited. All pets shall be prohibited. Coolers, glass bottles, breakable glasses and/or cups, and backpacks or large shoulder bags shall be prohibited; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that during the designated time the closed off portions of Taylor Street between Assembly Street and Gadsden Street; Lincoln Street between Hampton Street and Taylor Street; Gadsden Street between Hampton Street and Blanding Street; Hampton Street between Gadsden Street and Assembly Street; Park Street between Gervais Street and Taylor Street; Lady Street between Assembly Street and Lincoln Street; Washington Street between Lincoln Street and Assembly Street, with the exception of the parking area and any other areas posted as to not allow alcoholic beverages, shall be declared to be a Public Park and provisions of Chapter 15, Parks and Recreation, Sec. 15-1, 15-2 and 15-3, Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina are in effect. Pursuant to Chapter 14, Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions, Article IV, Offenses Against the Public Peace and Order,

Sec. 14-99, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina, the Festival area, with the exception of the parking area and any other areas posted as to not allow alcoholic beverages, is deemed to be the site of a public festival at which alcoholic beverages may be consumed and the prohibition against possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages set forth in Sec. 14-99 shall not apply. Possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted only in containers provided by vendors within the areas designated. Provided, however, that no solicitation or transactions be made in violation of Sec. 14-32, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the festival organizers and vendors are responsible for the removal of all property from the street and sidewalk rights of way and other public property immediately after the close of the festival on Sunday, April 18, 2004. Any property remaining as of 6:00 o'clock a.m. on Monday, April 19, 2004, shall be removed by the City of Columbia at the property owners expense.



I have reviewed the listed request and recommend that it be forwarded to City Council for approval with the following stipulations:

Thursday, April 15

- 7:00 p.m.Close Taylor from Assembly to Wayne ✓
- 7:00 p.m..... Close Gadsden from Blanding to Hampton ✓

Friday, April 16

- 9:00 a.m.....Close Washington from Lincoln to Assembly ✓
- 9:00 a.m.....Close Park from Taylor to Gervais ✓
- 9:00 a.m.....Close Lincoln from Hampton to Taylor ✓
(Park Side residents only)
- 3:00 p.m.....Close Hampton from Gadsden to Assembly ✓
(Park Side residents and Justice Square only)
- 5:00 p.m.....Close Lady from Lincoln to Assembly ✓

All streets will be open to traffic by 6:00 a.m. on Monday, April 19, 2004.

A. The sponsors will hire off duty police officers, fire marshals and other city staff as needed to provide services. **B.** Approve the standard resolution allowing consumption of alcohol, and that the alcohol sales will stop 30 minutes prior to the event ending. (See attached request.) **C.** The sponsors will hire ecology services to clean up the two-block area around the festival nightly. **D.** The sponsors will be responsible for renting lighted barricades to be placed around the festival area at closed off intersections.
