Approving the Honorary naming of the 2100, 2200 and 2300 blocks of Greene Street between Harden Street and Heidt Street "Joy Holman Way"

WHEREAS, Joy Holman was born in Harlem, New York and raised by her maternal grandparents in Lexington, South Carolina; and,

WHEREAS, Ms. Holman graduated from Lexington High School in 1974, having lettered and excelled in volleyball, basketball and track, she was also a varsity football cheerleader, team captain and most valuable player for the volleyball and basketball teams, and in 1993 was inducted into the Hall of Fame for her high school basketball career; and,

WHEREAS, Ms. Holman attended Benedict College on a basketball scholarship where she served as captain and most valuable player in three sports - basketball, volleyball and softball. She also performed with the college's dance group, pledged Delta Sigma Theta and was named Ms. Basketball #6. Ms. Holman received a Bachelor of Science Degree in Physical Education in 1976 and continued her post-graduate studies at the University of South Carolina; and,

WHEREAS, Ms. Holman played both the point and wing guard positions for three years in the first women's professional basketball league in the USA the Dayton Rockettes; and,

WHEREAS, Ms. Holman worked for the City of Columbia Parks and Recreation Division as a Park Leader then as an Athletic Specialist/Program Coordinator at Valley Park (now King Park) where she also coached and played Valley Girls Basketball, co-ed softball and volleyball while also playing softball with Lexington Community Softball teams, Alet's and the Ebony Ladies out of Columbia, the latter having won national and world titles; and,

WHEREAS, in 1985 she formed the Martin Luther King Double Dutch Jump Rope Team though she knew little about the sport, growing a four member team to over 100 jumpers who went on to win 338 state of South Carolina titles, 137 world titles, 99 2nd place world titles, 29 national titles and 5 grand national titles and se five national speed records. The Lil' Special Force team currently holds the world record in speed at 447 steps; and,

WHEREAS, Ms. Holman dedicated her life's work to improving the lives of young people as a Development Program Instructor with the Babcock Center in Lexington where she worked with clients with mental and physical disabilities. She also taught physical education in the Aiken County School System in Cyril Busbee Elementary and A.L. Corbett Middle schools in Wagener, South Carolina before retiring in 2015. At Busbee she implemented a Double Dutch Program known as The Wagener Force winning state and world champions and recognition; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED this 2nd day of October, 2018, that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbia hereby approve the honorary naming of the 2100, 2200 and 2300 blocks of Greene Street between Harden Street and Heidt Street "Joy Holman Way". The design and color of the honorary toppers shall be subject to the approval of the Director of Public Works.


